There is a state regulation that all teacher education programs in the state (a total of 4) must "substantially meet NCATE standards." The state was doing their own program reviews about twelve years ago and did not charge for the review.

In Washington, each candidate for certification pays a \$35 license fee, and it is from those fees that the state covers expenses, e.g. travel and hotel, of the visit.
